1. Welcome

2. President's Report: We have nominees for all positions for next year. There are two people running for secretary. Nominations are being accepted for the Dália M. Leonardo Library School Scholarship and the Jay Bernstein Memorial Scholarship. The deadline to submit a nominee is Friday, April 19. Derek sent out this email on April 10. 3. Treasurer's Update TDBank is allowing email address to be used and Mark has updated the page The PayPal account is now closed and zelle is being used. If anything comes in through zelle put the monies in the affinipay system which is used to accept credit cards and works together with Wild Apricot

Two donations were made, one by Sage for \$500, and OUP (Oxford University Press) for \$10,836. Nannette informed us that the LACUNY minutes have been historically uploaded to Academic Works for open viewing. Please continue to do this for public reference.

4. CCL Update: March meeting highlights included a report on the Suny/Cuny share project and indicates that we received 253 books while SUNY borrowed 540 books. Some chiefs are concerned about the OneSearch default for home campus and all of CUNY libraries. The ease of the Bright Space migration varies from each campus. Chiefs reported that for some schools the migration is seamless while others are having challenges with the transition. OLS is looking

to hire a university archivist. Central does not allow people to get tenure so people are less inclined to want to work at CUNY Central. OLS has been unable to get a full time cataloguer. There have been a series of part time employees as cataloguers. OLS is trying to figure out how to increase opportunities across campuses to help junior faculty advance. There are different standards across CUNY for tenure. The meeting also included discussions about bylaws related to librarians and workflow. In the April meeting we learned that the American Chemical Society journals will be free for open access. DEi mentorship is happening across campuses. The chief monograph sharing has 5 schools that are participating. One chief made a note of pointing out that since elections take place on the first week of May it may be wise to have future LACUNY Institute events happen at a different time

5. Membership / Recruitment: There are currently 145 full time, 3 lifetime members, and 11 associate members for a total of 159 members. Charles Keyes, librarian at Laguardia, is nominating Robert Farrell, librarian at Lehman College, for consideration as lifetime member. Farrell has made many positive contributions to our profession to boost the reputation of librarians within CUNY. For membership options we should consult the bylaws.
